

SIZE 1**NECKLINE & ARMHOLE INCREASES**

The following chart shows the increase section for the Left Front Shoulder, beginning with the Neckline Increase Rowsbox on page 8 of the pattern. It includes all neckline and armhole increases up to the point where you place the Left Front Shoulder on hold and continue with the Right Front Shoulder.

Please note that, to keep the chart as clear and easy to read as possible, the stockinette stitches between the armhole and neckline increases have been condensed. The chart therefore focuses primarily on the edges of each row where the increases take place.

Only the Left Front Shoulder is shown in the chart. The Right Front Shoulder is worked over the same intervals, but in reverse, so the chart can be used as a reference for both shoulders.

The second chart shows the joining of the Left and Right Front Shoulders into one Front Panel, beginning with the joining row. It then shows the remaining armhole increases and the final DS-group row, where all remaining DS stitches are dropped.

Again, to keep the chart clear and easy to read, the stockinette stitches between the edges and the middle DS group have been left out. The chart therefore focuses on the edges and the middle DS group, where the relevant changes take place.
